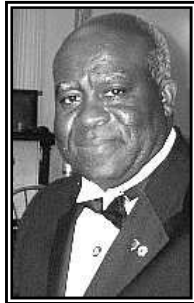

**LIBRARY LECTURE  
ON MASONIC EDUCATION**

Fifty brothers attended a lecture on "The State of Masonic Education" on December 10. The Chancellor Robert R Livingston Library of Grand Lodge sponsored this first in a series of dinner lectures at La Petite Auberge Restaurant in New York City.

Distinguished scholars and researchers from Quatuor Coronati Lodge No.2076 (London) presented a number of themes related to Masonic education. Brother S. Brent Morris is the Lodge's first American-born Master and discussed its history and impact on education throughout the Masonic World. He is also the Director of Publications, AASR Southern Jurisdiction.

The editor of QC's annual transactions is Brother Peter Currie, who presented topics regarding history, ritual, education and the future of Masonic education. Brother Currie shared a number of very old and historic documents from his own personal collection, including an ancient hand-written lecture/ritual book. It was quite amazing to see how little ritual has changed over the centuries and across the miles.

Brother Trevor Stewart rounded out the evening's discussions, presenting a highly-charged paper on widening our Masonic inquiries: what we can do to enhance our work in the educational process. Brother Stewart is a Past Master of QC and a Past Prestonian Lecturer.

The remaining cadre from QC included Past Prestonian Lecturers, Past Grand Wardens and professional educators from various universities: Brothers Charles Lawrence, Roger Burt, John Acaster, John Wade, and Granville Angell. Each brought a unique perspective on Masonic education that both challenged and delighted the Brothers present.

By all accounts, the event was a complete success and highly received. Library Trustees President Brother Barry Mallah noted the importance of Masonic education in his welcoming remarks. Library Director Brother Thomas M. Savini encouraged all to use the Library's online resources as a starting point for

both individual and group educational endeavors.

The Library is planning similar events for the future, especially outside the Metropolitan area. Brethren who are interested in hosting an event locally should contact the Library Director: (212) 337-6620.

Quatuor Coronati Lodge, No.2076 (London, England), chartered in 1886, is the oldest Lodge of Research. It is unique among Masonic Lodges. It is a Masonic Lodge but one which is exclusively concerned with Masonic Research. Its Latin title means "Four Crowned Ones." Since its inception, the Lodge has met at Freemasons' Hall, Great Queen Street. The Lodge produces annual Transactions (AQC) which are an invaluable source of information on Masonic matters. The Quatuor Coronati Correspondence Circle is open to all Master Masons in good standing from Grand Lodges in amity with the United Grand Lodge of England. Members in the QCCC enjoy the same privileges of members of Quatuor Coronati Lodge, except for the right to vote or hold office. They receive annual proceedings, summons and other publications. Mr. Keith H. L. Barclay was born in St. Thomas, Jamaica West Indies into a strong matriarchal family. His mother, Patrocella Barclay raised him along with his younger brother Dennis and Sister Valerie to uphold high personal standards. This ideal quickly transferred onto his children Nadine Barclay, Tracey-Ann Barclay Laird and Keith Barclay Jr. For as long as he can remember, Keith's firm Christian beliefs and undying will to succeed have served as the pinnacle of his upbringing. He often reflects on his life as a young man back in Jamaica which he credits for his strong work ethic and strong ambition. Most people often describe Keith as a man of high integrity and foresight. After relocating to the United States during the late 1970's, Keith along with his devoted wife Opal began to pave the future for their entire family.

Mr. Barclay always emphasized that "Education is the key to everything in life." When his daughters attended PS 127 and IS 145 respectively, Keith immediately joined the PTA eventually taking the position of the UFT Delegate because in his words "It's my duty as a parent to become involved in my children's school." Mr. Barclay readily takes on the task of being a mentor/role model to all young people he encounters whether at work, church or any other social settings. This unsung gesture of wanting to help others, has earned him respect and regard from his peers and colleagues. While attending a prior NAUW fundraiser, Mr. Barclay was compelled to act on behalf of a displaced Hurricane Katrina survivor working on his college degree. In true inconspicuous manner, Mr. Barclay immediately offered a personal donation to defray the student's educational costs.

Throughout his life, Mr. Barclay continues to share his spirit of generosity in support of community programs benefiting young people, namely disadvantaged young males. His willingness to assist others is actualized in his longstanding membership on the Vestry Board and Ushers Guild of The Church of the Resurrection, The Grace Episcopal Men's Club and Allied Lodge #1170 Free & Accepted Masons. Mr. Barclay often remarks that "Charity always begins in the home" and for over 30 years he has consistently done so in his "Home" community of East Elmhurst, Queens.

## IN MEMORY

### W.: Gerald S. Nagel

Brother Nagel, Jerry, as we lovingly called him, was taken from us on October 24<sup>th</sup>, way too soon. The youngest son of R.:W.: Abraham Nagel, who was the leader of Composite Lodge #819, for so many years. Jerry, like his father before him; to meet him once, was like you knew him forever. He was a warm and caring individual who together with his wife, Hadasa, extended the Nagel family with three sons, Mark, Seth and Jason and into Composite Lodge, a fourth generation of Nagels.

Jerry, besides being a past master of Composite, was also a member of New York Chapter order of DeMolay and whose brother, Stewart, was its first Master Counselor. The Nagel family was involved in community activities both in and around our fraternity. Jerry, like his father, Abe, was the type of individual that loved to help his fellowman.

A lifelong resident of the Lower East Side, Jerry was raised in a traditional Jewish home and decided to commit his career to the Jewish community and to enroll his sons in a Jewish day school, after serving as a press officer at the United Nations in the late 1970's, the period of the infamous resolution that declared Zionism a form of racism.

"He saw what people" – representatives of nations hostile to Israel – "were saying at the meetings. What they said wasn't being contested," said Mark Nagel, Jerry's son.

From 1983 to 1997, Jerry served as chief communications officer of UJA, dealing with the media during such historical events as the airlifts of Ethiopian Jews to Israel, the exodus of Soviet Jewry and the assassination of Israeli Prime Minister Yitzchak Rabin. He also helped organize the march on Washington, for Soviet Jewry in 1987.

Jerry made several trips to Israel and the former Soviet Union (he brought tefillin and other banned objects to refuseniks in the USSR), and interviewed many world leaders, Mark Nagel said.

He attended Bronx Community College and the City University of New York. He earned a master's degree from the Columbian School of Journalism, and a doctorate in education from Columbia University.

He worked as a journalist for several newspapers and taught journalism at the high school and collegiate level before taking the UN job.

After leaving UJA, he opened his own fundraising-marketing consulting firm, working with such organizations as the Hebrew Home for the Aged and UJA-Federation of New York. He was a board member of Hadassah magazine and the Bialystoker Synagogue.

His book about the Jewish missions on behalf of Soviet and Ethiopian Jewry, "Operation Exodus: The Inside Story of American Jews in the Greatest Rescues of Our Time," was published last year by Contemporary History Press.

Brother Nagel, who was raised – Composite Lodge on May 11, 1965, passed away in Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in Manhattan at the young age of 63. For those of us who knew him, we will never forget him. He made his mark here on earth and with the blessings of God will live in our hearts forever.
